Are you Safeguarding Compliant? - We can help!



Below is a basic outline of what Faith Groups in Scotland require to stay safeguarding compliant. This Flowchart is designed as a brief overview only and should not be taken as legal advice.

All management committee members and the Lead and Deputy for Safeguarding require the following:

All staff or volunteers working abroad require the following:

Disclosure Scotland checks at a level appropriate to their role* (if possible) and / or an International Child Protection Certificate (ICPC) for UK nationals who are travelling and working overseas

International Child Safeguarding Training

Your faith group needs both child and adult safeguarding and related policies in place, including a "Whistleblowing" statement.
